During that time he was involved in various community organisations, especially relating to disability (he is legally blind).

Since joining the Society, he has worked with refugees and detained asylum seekers at Jesuit Refugee Service and elsewhere and served on the Board of Jesuit Social Services. Other ministries include writing and work with students at Newman College and with children with disabilities at St Paul's, Kew. Justin was ordained a priest in August 2016 and is presently studying for a Licence in Canon Law at St Paul University, Ottawa.

He enjoys singing and languages (and finds in them ever new ways of discovering God and others) and is keenly interested in law and international affairs.
